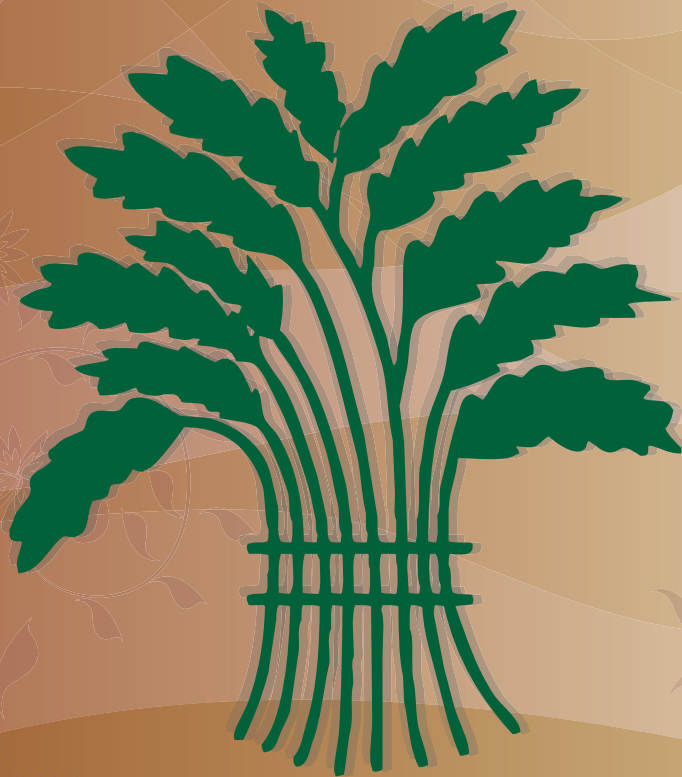

BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS

ORSETT HORTICULTURAL AND AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

1. COMPLIANCE WITH BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS:

- a The Society's By-Laws and Regulations, and any conditions in the Prize Schedule or any other rules, regulations, conditions or schedules in any document published by the Society shall be binding on all members and exhibitors. All persons, animals, vehicles, equipment and articles of whatsoever kind entering the Showground or any land used by the Society shall be bound by and comply with the Bye-Laws and Regulations of the Council of the Society and to the lawful directions of any servant or agent appointed by them.
- b Should any member or exhibitor conduct himself in an improper or offensive manner on the Showground or if it be proven to the satisfaction of the Council that any exhibitor has attempted to mislead the Society by any form of misrepresentation, or has violated any of the Bye-Laws or Regulations of the Society, then and in any such case the Council may decline to allow the member concerned to renew his membership or the exhibitor concerned to exhibit to any future Shows, and may forfeit any prize or prize money of such exhibitor.
- c The Society reserves the right to refuse any person admission to the Showground or entry and participation in any event promoted or organised by the Society or to withdraw permission at any time to remain on the Showground or to participate in any event, and the Society shall not be required to give any reason for such action.

d COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL AUTHORITY REGULATIONS AND ALL CODES OF PRACTICE:

All Shows, Exhibitions and Events organised by the Society on the Showground or elsewhere are subject to any relevant orders issued by Government Departments and Local Authorities, and all codes of practice with all exhibitors and others attending such Shows, Exhibitions or Events must comply.

2. LIABILITY

- a In this By-Law the term exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any event, competition or display, promoted or arranged by the Society and the owner of any exhibit, animal, plant vehicle, equipment, machinery, article or other thing of whatever nature involved in any such event, competition or display or otherwise exhibited or used on the Showground or elsewhere.
- b Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Society, its servants or agents, the Society will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his or her servants or agents or to any exhibit, animal, vehicle, equipment, plant, machinery, article, or thing of whatever nature brought onto the Showground by the exhibitor or involved in any said event, competition or display.

- c Save as aforesaid, the exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all claims, losses, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of or the taking part of the exhibitor, his or her servants, agents, exhibit, animals, plant, vehicle, equipment, machinery, articles or other things of whatever nature on the Showground or elsewhere and shall assume full responsibility therefore.
 - d Acceptance of this By-Law shall be a condition of entry or participation in any event, competition or display, promoted or arranged by the Society.
 - e The Society accepts no responsibility or liability whatsoever for any statement or information in any document published by the Society or the Show.
3. The Society will in no case accept liability for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect) arising from or caused by the abandonment or cancellation, whether total or partial, or the postponement of any show, display, event, meeting or other happening on the showground or elsewhere for whatever reason.

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO ARRANGE APPROPRIATE INSURANCE COVER AND THE COUNCIL RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REQUEST THE PRODUCTION OF AND INSPECT SUCH POLICIES ON THE DAY OF COMPETITION.

4 CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

- a Persons are admitted to vehicle parks and to the Showground at their own risk. Vehicles and their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the parks and Showground at the risk of owners. Whilst every endeavour is taken to ensure their safety the Society will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Society, its servants or agents) be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise) loss or damage to property, nor for any other loss, damage, cost or expenses direct or indirect however caused or arising.
- b All persons entering the vehicle parks and Showground are subject to the Rules, By-Laws and regulations of the Orsett Horticultural and Agricultural Society, a copy of which can be seen at the Secretary's Office.

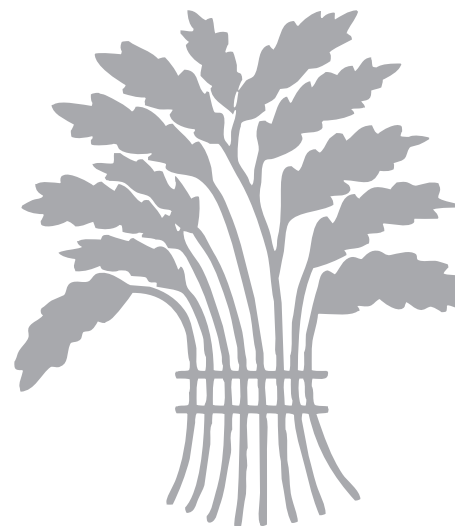

REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ALL EXHIBITS IN THE AGRICULTURAL AND MARKET GROWER'S CLASSES

- The exact number and kind of articles mentioned in the Entry must be sent, otherwise the Exhibit may be disqualified.
- Cards bearing the number and variety, wherever possible, must be attached to each Exhibit. These cards will be sent by the Secretary to the Exhibitors.
- The Stewards reserve the right to refuse any Entry in any Class should they deem it necessary.
- The Stewards will not be answerable for any damage or loss that may occur to any Exhibit.
- In the event of any doubt or dispute arising as to the interpretation of these regulations, the decision of the Stewards shall be final.
- In this Section, all Exhibits shown for Prizes shall be the produce of the Exhibitor, and shall have been grown commercially on land farmed by the Exhibitor at least three months previous to the date of the Show. The Stewards reserve the right to visit the fields of any Exhibitor before or after the Show. Any Exhibitor who is proved to have exhibited Produce not of his own growing shall be disqualified, as determined by the Stewards.
- No person will be allowed to show more than one exhibit of each variety in each class.
- It is expected that Exhibits shall be exhibited as neatly as possible in the space provided. Sugar Beet to have the leaves and roots left on (they may be cleaned if desired). Potatoes may be washed. Market Grower Classes-Entries must be presented in a Tray to be provided by the Exhibitor. Entries normally classified as Horticultural will not be accepted in this Section. Threshed Barley, Oats, Peas and Wheat must be presented to the Stewards in 10 kg lots. From the lot so presented the Exhibitor will fill a special container, about 5 kg, as provided by the Section. The final sample of some 5 kg will then be deemed to be the Entry made by the Exhibitor in the appropriate Class.
- Exhibits will be received on the Show day from 8.00 a.m. to 09.00 a.m. Any exhibits arriving after that time may be marked "too late" and not entitled to any prize.
- Judging will commence at 09.00 a.m. The show will open at the conclusion of judging and close at 4.30 p.m. No Exhibits may be removed before 4.30 p.m. but any exhibit remaining after 4.45 p.m. may be disposed of by the Stewards as they so decide.
- No person except responsible officials shall be allowed near the Enclosure during the time the Judges are making their awards. If they decline, they may be disqualified.
- Any Exhibitor feeling himself aggrieved by any decision or mistake whatsoever, on entering a protest shall give notice in writing to the Secretary before 3 o'clock in the afternoon on the day of the show, and shall, at the same time deposit with the Secretary the sum of £10.00 which shall be forfeited to the Stewards if such objection or protest be deemed frivolous by the Judges or Stewards.
- The Stewards reserve the right to enter any 1st prize winning exhibit in the County Competition unless the exhibitor requests otherwise.
- THE SOCIETY'S GENERAL BY-LAWS AND GENERAL REGULATIONS SHALL APPLY TO ALL ENTRIES EXHIBITORS AND PERSONS ATTENDING THE SHOW.**

SHEAF CLASSES – The Judge will now be instructed to award points as follows:

3. 3. 15 kg Combined Oats said to be a true sample of the bulk as offered or sold.
4. 15 kg Combined Winter Malting Barley said to be a true sample of the bulk as offered or sold.
5. 15 kg Combined Spring Malting Barley said to be a true sample of the bulk as offered or sold.
6. 15 kg of Combined Feeding Barley said to be a true sample of the bulk as offered or sold, and sown before 31st December.
7. 15 kg of Combined Wheat said to be a true sample of the bulk as specified, offered or sold for Group 1 NABIM Wheat Guide.
8. 15 kg Combined Wheat said to be a true sample of the bulk as specified, offered or sold for Group 2 NABIM Wheat Guide.
9. 15 kg Combined Wheat said to be a true sample of the bulk as specified, offered or sold for Group 4 NABIM Wheat Guide.
10. 15 kg Combined Rye said to be a true sample of the bulk as specified, offered or sold from this season's crop.
11. 15 kg Combined Durum Wheat said to be a true sample of the bulk as specified, offered or sold from this season's crop.
12. 5 kg Combined Oilseed Rape said to be a true sample of the bulk as specified, offered or sold from this season's crop.
13. 5 kg Combined Linseed said to be a true sample of the bulk as offered or sold from this season's crop.
14. 15 kg Combined Feeding Beans said to be a true sample of the bulk as offered or sold from this season's crop.

15. 15 kg Combined Canning Peas other than Marrowfat said to be a true sample of the bulk of this season's crop.
16. 15 kg Combined Canning Peas including Marrowfat said to be a true sample of this season's crop.
17. 15 kg Combined Feeding Peas said to be a true sample of the bulk of this season's crop.
18. 6 Sugar Beet, any variety.
19. One Bale best quality Meadow Hay, this season's crop.
20. One Bale best quality Lucerne or Mixtures Hay, this season's crop.
21. Potatoes, earlies. White variety, minimum 20 kg.
22. Potatoes, main crop. Any white variety, minimum 20 kg.
23. Potatoes, any coloured variety, minimum 20 kg.
24. Tray of Parsnips (minimum of 10 kg nett weight).
25. Tray of Cabbage (minimum of 6 cabbages).
26. Tray of Runner Beans (minimum of 4 kg nett weight).
27. Tray of Marrows (minimum of 8 marrows).
28. Trays of Round Beet (minimum of 10 kg nett weight).
29. Tray of Spring Onions (minimum of 18 bunches).
30. Tray of Sweetcorn (minimum of 12 cobs).
31. Tray of Leeks (minimum of 4 kg nett weight).
32. Tray of Harvest Onions (minimum of 4 kg).
33. Tray of Calabrese (minimum of 4kg).
34. Tray of Cauliflower (minimum of 4kg).
35. Tray of Lettuce, including speciality lettuce (minimum of 10 Lettuce).
36. Farm Shop Display (maximum area 4' x 4') English Produce.
37. Tray of Pumpkins (minimum of 3 pumpkins).
38. Tray of Miniature Squash (minimum 6).
39. Tray of Herbs.
40. Tray of Exotic Vegetables.

Prizes

The "Lecquire Perpetual Silver Challenge Cup"

To be competed for annually on a points basis in the Agricultural Classes only. First in the Class counts 3 points; Second in the Class 2 points; Highly Commended in the Class, 1 point. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the greater number of First awards to be a winner. In addition to which a cash prize of £10.00 for the winner.

The "Knight Perpetual Silver Challenge Cup"

To be awarded annually on a points basis in the Market Growers Classes only, i.e. First, 3 points, Second, 2 points, Highly Commended, 1 point. In addition to which a cash prize of £10.00 for winner.

The "L. J. Osborne Perpetual Challenge Cup"

For best exhibit in Potato Classes. In addition to which a cash prize of £10.00 for winner.

The "Boorman Perpetual Silver Challenge Cup"

To be awarded annually for the best presented Sheaf in the show in addition to which a special prize of £10.00 for winner.

The "Allied Mills – Sunblest Cup"

To be awarded annually for the best Milling Wheat in the show in addition to which a special prize of £50.00 for winner.

The "Frontier Agriculture Cup" (previously Allied Grain Cup)

To be awarded annually for the best Milling Rye in the show, in addition to which a special prize of £40.00 for winner.

The "R & T – Rape Cup"

To be awarded annually for the best Rape in the show with addition of £10.00 for winner.

"The Peter Butler Memorial Cup"

Will be presented for the Best Farm Shop Display, in addition to which a cash prize of £20.00 for the winner.

"The Harlow Agricultural Cup"

For best Malting Barley, a cash prize of £10.00 for the winner.

The "Dengie Crop - Prize"

£75.00 for best Canning Peas.

"The Dan Markham Cup"

For best bale of meadow hay in the show, in addition to which a cash prize of £10.00 for the winner.

The "Allied Mills Durum Wheat Prize"

£100 for best Durum Wheat in show.

REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ALL EXHIBITS IN THE HOBBIES AND HANDICRAFTS SECTION

- The exact number and kind of articles mentioned in the schedule of classes must be exhibited, otherwise, the exhibit will be disqualified.
- Exhibitor cards and produce labels etc. can be collected from the H&H Marquee during the times given in Regulation 10 below. The cards must be placed face down with each exhibit.
- The decision of the Judges shall be final and they shall have discretionary power in cases where the exhibits are of doubtful quality, or where there are not more than three competitors, to diminish or withhold any of the prizes offered.
- The Stewards reserve the right to refuse any entry in any Class.
- The Stewards will not be answerable for any damage or loss that may occur to any exhibit.
- In the event of any doubt or dispute by any exhibitor regarding the interpretation of these Regulations, the decision of the Stewards shall be final.
- All persons intending to exhibit or compete must obtain an Entry Form from the Entry Secretary or from the show website, which must be completed and returned by the given closing date.
- All articles entered shall, except where stated, be the produce and property of the exhibitor. Any person who is proved to have exhibited produce not their own, shall be disqualified, as determined by the Stewards.
- Exhibitors may enter up to four items in a Class, but no single item may be shown in more than one Class and Exhibitors shall not be entitled to more than one award in any one Class.
- Exhibits will be received in the H&H Marquee on the Show Ground on Friday between 4pm and 7pm and on Show Day between 7am and 8am (**Note: those bringing their exhibits on show day will be required to purchase an entry ticket**). Exhibits received after this time may not be judged.
- Judging will begin at 9am. The H&H Marquee will be open by 11am, or on conclusion of judging, and will close at 5pm. Exhibits are not to be removed from the show bench until 5pm.
- The H&H Marquee will be closed to exhibitors and members of the public while judging is in progress. Any exhibitor attempting to gain entry during this time will be disqualified.
- Any exhibitor feeling himself aggrieved by any decision or mistake shall give notice in writing to the Chief Steward before 2.30pm on the day of the Show and shall at the same time deposit with the Chief Steward the sum of £10, which shall be forfeited to the Stewards if such objection or protest be deemed frivolous or unfounded by the Judges or Stewards.
- Prize money will be awarded at the Stewards table after the presentation of Cups and Trophies. Rosettes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place. Prize money will be awarded as follows: 1st £3, 2nd £2, 3rd £1 in all classes.

2. Cards bearing the number should be placed face downwards with each exhibit. These cards can be collected from the horticultural tent on the Show Ground.
3. The decision of the Judges shall be final, and they shall have a discretionary power in cases where the productions are of doubtful quality or where there are not more than three competitors to diminish or withhold any of the prizes offered.
4. The stewards reserve the right to refuse any entry in any class should it be deemed necessary.
